

Course - The Future of Revolutions in Central and Eastern Europe

If you are a master or doctoral level student of political science and/or international relations, who is interested in the foreign and security policy issues, then we would like to invite <u>YOU</u> to join other students from Central Europe (V4 in an interactive 5-day long forum focused on the Future of Revolutions in Central and Eastern Europe.

Course main goal:

Course divided into specific units that will cover all the areas of the state and position of the revolution in modern society, including the views to the future. The course will be focused on potential threats, that could lead to another period of so-called "Great Revolution". The main aim of the course is to focus on various instances of conquest, a form of revolutions and war (including genocide), explore and analyze organized and state-led violence, that has continued to shape global past and contemporary experience in the new century. History of the humankind has been forged by violence associated with changes and revolutions, as it was at the beginning of the 20th century in our region. While there are many examples of progress and positive changes in the world of human, the dark episodes came back in every historical period. In this light the course will focus on the dark side of human history - the course invites to gain insight into events and processes which resulted in mass violence, physical, psychological or social form. The course will also focus on memory and memory wars of our societies within the events of the Russian revolution.

The inner structure of the course will be divided into three main section:

- **A)** The first will be the lectures on revolution memory wars, identity in Visegrad countries, the heritage of the past and the future.
- **B)** The second section will be focused on the panel debate every day after the lecture, the main aim is to improve participants knowledge training and coaching in working groups, and
- **C)** the third section presentation and evaluation of course with the active involvement of participants.
